

CVLGC Spring Meeting Minutes March 15, 2023

Toni Coleman started the meeting by welcoming back two previous members – Barb Brown and Stephanie Atwood. Toni then introduced to current board members – herself as president and Elaine Hartmann as vice president. Not present were Bette Niemi (treasurer) and Barb Dames (e-mails). The fall meeting minutes were read and accepted.

The treasury report stated a \$304.19 carryover from 2022. As of March 15th, 32 members had paid their fees and the current balance was now \$2177.19.

Our first league day will be April 5 with a shotgun start at 9 a.m. If members were not present at the meeting and wish to play on this day, please contact the clubhouse. In May the start time shift to 8:30 a.m. Winter rules – play the ball up everywhere except in hazards, roll ball one club length no closer to the hole – will be in effect in April and May.

The league schedule will be as follows:

- May 10 Charlie Vettiner will host interclub.
- June 26 & 27 Jeff County Ladies Golf Tournament at Charlie Vettiner. Sandy Holloway reported there will be a slight increase to the entry fee. Registration forms will be available soon.
- Aug 9 & 16 CVLGC championship – August 9th will be tee times and August 16th will be shotgun start. Some discussion was held about what type of flights will be used – separate red and pink flights or all intermingled. Since several new members have joined and the current flights – 1st flight up to 20, 2nd flight 21 to 30, and 3rd flight 31 and up – will be reviewed and adjusted as needed. The possibility of a pink champion as well as a red champion was also discussed. This will depend on which tees membership decides to play. A decision will be made closer to the championship dates.
- October 11 Year-end scramble and luncheon. This year a list will be circulated for ladies to volunteer to bring a dish towards the luncheon.

Elaine will organize the match play tournament which will occur through the summer.

Patrick, CV pro, will do team events on June 14, July 12, and September 13.

This year the birdie club and closest to the pin have been combined under the fees. Birdies will be limited to one birdie per hole for a maximum of 18 birdies. Kathi McKeown said to go on and post all of birdies and she will be sure none are duplicated. The closest to the pin winnings (\$4) will now be shown in the money book.

A hole-in-one option has been added to fees this year. Anyone making a hole-in-one will win the pot. If multiple ladies make a hole-in-one, then the pot will be divided. If no one makes a hole-in-one, the ladies who paid the hole-in-one fee will have their names entered into a pot at the end of the year and multiple names will be drawn to disburse the pot.

Teri Raque will be running 50/50 pots during team events, interclub, and the yearend scramble.

A discussion was held as to how the weekly game winners will be recorded into the money book. It was decided that someone from one of the last two foursomes will be responsible to identify the weekly game winners and enter that information into the money book as well as the closest to the pin winner. This person will need to ensure that \$4 is awarded to each flights' winner per week. Elaine will type up instructions and place them into the money book so everyone knows what needs to be done.

Members were reminded that if they do not sign up to play for league play on league day, they have until close of business on Sunday to sign up for the next league play day. Be sure to contact the clubhouse.

A recommendation that the meeting be adjourned was made and seconded.
